Updates CMS COVID-19 Vaccination Mandate COVID-19 Healthcare ETS & OSHA COVID-19 Vaccination and Testing ETS

The following provides clarification and status of the two Emergency Temporary Standards (ETS) issued by OSHA along with the CMS Mandate.

<u>CMS Vaccination Mandate</u>: This rule requires all healthcare workers of Medicare and Medicaid certified hospitals and other healthcare facilities to be fully vaccinated unless they receive a medical or religious exemption. On 1/12/2022 the Supreme Court issued a <u>decision</u> allowing CMS to require this rule.

OSHA COVID-19 Healthcare ETS: This standard mandates that all hospitals and other specified healthcare facilities develop a COVID-19 Plan to protect healthcare workers from COVID-19 and was published on 6/21/2021. See Summary COVID-19 Healthcare ETS for the rest of the requirements.

Because OSHA did not finalize a permanent standard within 6 months, the OSHA COVID-19 Healthcare ETS was withdrawn on 12/21/2021. OSHA noted that it will continue to work toward issuance of a permanent rule and will continue to enforce the standard using the general duty clause. Also, please note that the rule requiring employers to report COVID-19 work related fatalities and inpatient hospitalizations as well as maintaining the COVID-19 Log are still in effect.

OSHA COVID-19 Vaccination ETS: This standard mandates vaccination and testing for workers at employers having 100 or more workers. This ETS <u>DOES NOT INCLUDE healthcare workers</u>. However, on 1/12/2022 the Supreme Court issued a <u>decision</u> blocking this standard from taking effect.
